The 1990 T_EX meeting in Europe is the fifth such conference organised since 1985. It also breaks new ground as the first to be a T_EX Users Group (TUG) meeting outside North America. The T_EX computer typesetting program is now widely established as the *de facto* standard in scientific, educational and commercial use for the setting of documents requiring very high standards of typographic control, particularly technical documents, and for applications where high quality, portability and device-independence are of importance.

Conference location:

The conference will take place in University College, Cork from Monday 10th September to Thursday 13th September 1990. A wide variety of accommodation is available in hotels, guest houses and student hostels and can be booked direct with the tourist office (Bórd Fáilte) or with the conference office.

The City of Cork is located half-way along the south coast of Ireland at the head of Cork Harbour. Access is easy, with regular flights from Dublin, London and continental Europe, and direct ferry services to Swansea in the UK and Roscoff and Le Havre in France.

Nearby is Blarney Castle with the famous Stone of Eloquence; Fota House and Estate with its Wildlife Park; and a wide range of sporting facilities, including fishing, riding, sailing, surfing, swimming and golf. The city has a good variety of entertainment: cinemas, theatres, its own Ballet Company and Symphony Orchestra, and Irish Traditional Music in many venues.
